Electronic Dictionary and Corpus of Polish Medieval Latin

(abstract)

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Lexicon mediae et infimae Latinitatis Polonorum

The dictionary of Polish Medieval Latin, *Lexicon Mediae et Infimae Polonorum*, has been published since 1953 under the auspices of the Polish Academy of Sciences. This scholarly work attempts to give an account of the development of the Latin language as it was used on the Polish territory between the tenth and the middle of the sixteenth century.

In order to make it widely accessible, our team has launched a project aimed at the creation of an electronic dictionary, *eLexicon* (including entries from A to Q of the original printed work). Once completed, the open-access resource will be available to the scholarly community in two main forms. Firstly, it will be free to download as a set of TEI-conformant XML files; secondly, it will be accessible as a web application.

This tool is expected to become an access point of a larger platform of medieval text studies. Not only will it be dynamically linked to the scanned images of paper slips and the bibliographic list of medieval sources, but it will be closely integrated with the textual corpus that the same team has been working on from 2012. The five-million words form a balanced and representative corpus of Polish Medieval Latin, *eFontes*, which is due to be delivered by the end of 2016. Both resources are already or will soon be incorporated into larger research infrastructures, such as WikiLexicographica. Their creators actively participate in such European projects as the COST Actions “Medioevo Europeo” and “European Network of e-Lexicography”.
